DRUG TESTING & SUPPLEMENT WARNING

Drug testing for performance-enhancing substances at ICN events is conducted at WADA-accredited labs. Banned ingredients in USA supplements, especially pre-workout products taken on event day, have produced positive drug tests. As a rule, don't take any supplement three days before the competition. This will avoid an inadvertent positive test from a substance only banned "in competition," which is mostly the problem we see with pre-workouts and in other supplement contamination cases.




iPRO ICN GUARANTEE

While amateur divisions are subject to cancellation and amalgamation, Professional classes are never cancelled due to low numbers as a professional can not change divisions. Prize money however will be adjusted on the following scale: If only 1 competitor they will be awarded the cash prize of third place. If two competitors they will receive the cash prize of second and third. When 3 and more competitors enter the full cash prize will be awarded as promoted.

NOTE: Each Open (Height Class) Winner will be awarded their iPRO Card and are therefore eligible to enter and compete in the PRO class on the same day. You must pay the PRO entry fee of \$350 if you intend to compete. A PQ winner who places Top 3 in the PRO lineup will also win their PRO Card. Enter and pay by going to the Check-in table.

OPEN HEIGHT CLASS WINNERS WILL RECEIVE A PRO QUALIFIER CARD

Each Open or Open Height Class Division Winner will receive ICN PRO Qualified Status, which allows the Athlete to enter 2025 ICN PRO Shows in the specific division in which they received the PRO Qualifier card while still retaining full Amateur status. Competing in a PRO Show can earn you your PRO card (and prize money) if you place in the Top 3.

12. Onstage Photos:

You receive all the photographs taken of you and your division for \$50. You can edit and print all the pictures. A link to your photos is emailed within 2 weeks of the event.

13. Travelling Advice for International Competitors

The minimum time required to recover from the effects of jet lag is one hour for every hour you spend travelling. Try to arrive (Thursday 12th) in the afternoon or evening so you can sleep and wake at the correct time. When you board the plane in your Country, adjust your watch to the time in Bali and eat according to the time here. Same applies to sleep. Drink plenty of water. Eat Lightly. When booking your airline ticket, ask for low fat meals to be served. But also take your own food on the plane with your carry-on luggage. Also bring some packaged food in your suitcase, so you can survive for several meals without the stress of finding bodybuilding food immediately upon arriving.

Consider using melatonin tablets (5-8 mg) before bed. This will help you overcome jetlag, the stress of travelling and help you sleep. Melatonin is produced by the pineal gland and in response to darkness. During the day melatonin levels are low. Melatonin can help reset the body clock.

Don't be critical of your contest condition as you can expect to be 20% off your local contest condition due to the rigours of travel however, everyone is similarly handicapped. That is why I say those who win international events are those who travel best and do not get upset by unexpected situations. Try and plan so you can be very self reliant.

Bring your own sheets and pillowcase to sleep in the bed. Otherwise, can get away with just a pillowcase and old "jammies" to sleep in. Hotels usually pass-out when they see the tanning stains left behind by bodybuilders and they will charge you an outrageous cleaning fee.

One important message about competing internationally – hope for the best and prepare for the worst. The way another country runs a contest may vary from what you expect, purely because each country has different preferences, resources and strengths. Also, International promoters only know the extent of who is competing at the last moment. It can throw scheduling out. So be flexible in your mind and last minute preparation. However, rest assured the Bali International will be a fantastic experience for everyone.

14. VISA

Entering Bal is simple for most nationalities, which makes it an ideal destination for an international event. The information below will enable to to do everything yourself. Otherwise you can engage and Agent to help you at www.bali.com

There are four requirements to enter Indonesia, and you need to access four different websites to complete - so here is your step-by-step guide to make it easy!

You can check the requirements for a Visa depending on your passport.

Passport

Your passport must be valid for at least six months from the date you enter Indonesia. It should be undamaged, with no tears, water damage, or significant wear. Your passport should also have at least one empty page for the visa or arrival and departure stamp.

1. Visa

You'll need a Visa On Arrival (VoA) or an Electronic Visa on Arrival (e-VOA). You can apply for an e-VOA online at least two days before your trip. https://evisa.imigrasi.go.id/ You can also apply at bali airport. The fee is Rp500,000 US\\$35 (A\\$50) per person, plus a small processing fee. Take cash to pay.

Return ticket

You must have a return ticket back to your country or an onward flight to another country.

2. Tourism levy

You must pay a tourism levy of IDR150,000 (approx. AUD\$14.40). You can pay the fee online before you come or at the airport. https://lovebali.baliprov.go.id/

3. Customs declaration

You must complete the Electronic Customs Declaration (ECD) form, either at the airport or online up to 48 hours before landing in Bali. https://www.travelindonesia-ecd.com

4. Health pass

You must complete the SATUSEHAT Health Pass (SSHP) before boarding your flight to Bali. You must submit the completed SSHP to the airport health authorities upon arrival. https://sshp.kemkes.go.id/

NOTE: Most countries can apply for a VoA (Visa on Arrival) at the airport. You apply for a general visa for tourist activities. (*ignore the option for a sporting visa – this applies for mega events like F1 Grand Prix*).

15. Transport

Transport is cheap and efficient in Bali. Download either GOJEK or UBER apps to get transport for noral daily trips. If you want a driver and car for all day, we will help you organise this with a driver we know and trust.

16. SIM Card and Money Exchange

Getting a SIM card and internet access in Bali is cheap and easy. The most convenient option is at the airport – you won't need to look, as you will be bombarded to buy a sim card from multiple airport kiosks after you clear customs. The advantage is you are online from your first minute in Bali. The cheapest option is always away from the airport, and a telecom shop is everywhere. The savings might be significant as a % but in dollar terms, it's very little. If this is your first time to Bali and only staying a week the airport option is easy.

Changing money is different. At the airport only get enough Indonesian money for immediate spending. Even the money exchange booth in the terminal carpark100M from arrivals is 20% better and a good option. Otherwise, go to a "legitimate-looking" currency exchange shop near your hotel. Avoid any small outlets with a fantastic rate – if the rate is too good to be true its because they will scam you (miscount the notes, etc).

17. Divisions Explained

ROOKIE

Rookie is your first year (12 months) of competing in that specific division.

Rookie is specific to the division and how much experience you have competing in the particular division. For example, you may have competed for three years in Men's Fitness, and now, stepping up to Men's Physique, you can start in the Rookie Division and enter Rookie in Men's Physique for the next 12 months.

NOVICE

Competitors cannot enter if they have won (placed first) in an Open Division or Open Height Class in that specific division.

OPEN

Open is the highest level of any particular Division where the best of the best is determined. Open is, as the name refers, open to anyone who wants to compete. Typically, the biggest and best prizes are given to the Open Winners, including Pro Qualifier Cards.

Height Class (if required)

A division may be divided into Height Classes if required. Height classes are not preset, but created according to the heights of competitors who have entered the division. For example, if we have 18 entries in the Bikini Open, we may create 2 Height Classes of 9 competitors according to height from short to tallest. As it goes according to the height of the competitors, you could find you are in Class one in SportsModel but Class 2 in FintessModel because its according to the height of competitors in the division.
